## CHURCHWARDENS' CHATTER

We would both like to thank you all for your support during our terms of office which come to an end at the end of this month at the Annual Parochial Church Meeting on 28<sup>th</sup> at 2pm in the church. This means that new scribes will fill this slot in the Newsletter from then on.

Our contractors commenced the brickwork refurbishment to the basement entrance with a view of completion this month, weather permitting. The refurbishment of the metalwork and its health and safety requirements may take a little longer to complete.

The programme for the works to complete 'Access for all' is still to be concluded but is imminent.

### **Important Notice**

While the 'Access for All' works are being carried out public access to the church will be through the west door (under the tower) with the construction area being fenced off for health and safety reasons, with no public access.

We will shortly have completed the ramps to the storage containers so we can gain wheel access for all equipment. The erecting of trellis and fencing is in progress and it is hoped to be completed by the start of summer Teas.

Reduction of the ground level surrounding the church within the confine of the path have commenced and is an effort to reduce damp penetration into the church. Once at the required level the areas will be reseeded.

All our church electrical equipment has been tested and passed the P.A.T. test, our Lincat water heater serviced ready for the summer Teas season and we await for the lightning conductor to be certified this month, likewise the fire extinguishers.

We still have a number of tasks to complete which include removing the old timber shed and clearing away, decorating the picnic benches and the toilet block, these will be carried out by the Community Pay Back Team as and when they are available and the weather conditions on the day. They also carry out mowing and strimming as and when available which is a great help in keeping the churchyard tidy, for which we thank them.

Summer afternoon Teas start this year on Sunday 5<sup>th</sup> May at 2.30pm until 5.30pm.

The April Friday meeting for the Upshire Community Festival will be in the small hall of Upshire Village Hall at 8pm on 12<sup>th</sup>, a week earlier than normal to avoid the Easter weekend.

**CAR PARKING** can be a problem and we are trying to resolve this in conjunction with the Village Hall Trustees. For the 9.15am Service you can park in the Village Hall car park but only ON THE GRAVEL as this will allow the hirers of the hall to park on the tarmac and unload from their cars, etc. At all other times please observe the parking notices and follow their instruction as hirers of the village hall have sole rights to park there. Thank you.

When parking in the churchyard, we respectfully ask you not to park outside the containers or along the right side of the roadway to the car park, in front of the Garden of Remembrance or block the access to the church. It is vital to keep this area clear should it be necessary for any of the emergency services to come up to the church. Thank you.
