

We are a friendly group who meet on the
4th Wednesday of the month in the Village Hall,
Upshire at 2.15pm until 4pm or in St Thomas' Church for our Corporate Communion Services at 2.15.



At our January meeting Bryn Elliott gave an interesting talk, accompanied by a slide show, on 'Lippitts Hill Camp in War and Peace'. Lippitts Hill Camp was originally a rose nursery until the military took over. In 1932 it was set up as a gun site. The adjacent Thompson Wood was already a gun site in the Great War, but it was decided more guns were needed to protect the Small Arms factory in the Lea Valley.

In the summer of 1942 the Americans arrived and the British guns gave way to the B Battery of the US Military. By mid June 1944 the Americans had gone and the site was returned to the British and then became a Prisoner of War camp for the captured German soldiers. By the end of the 40s the POW camp had gone too. Some of the prisoners stayed in Britain, one being Walter Weiland who later became a naturalised Briton and went on to become Waltham Abbey Town Mayor in 1989. Both the Americans and the Germans left memorials of their stay, which can still be seen today. All that is left of the Americans is a brick pillar, the brass plaque was stolen. The Germans left a carved concrete statue of a man, this is just inside the gate.

In the 50s the London Police moved their training for police cadets, dogs and horses to Lippitts Hill Camp. In 1966 the firearms training was also set up and in 1967 the Police Helicopter arrived. As it had better security than other helicopter sites and being out of Area Control at Heathrow, it became a base for all areas. In 2003 the guns were pulled out and moved to Gravesend.

In 2012 it was used as a base for the Air Ambulance during the Olympics. In 2015 the National Police Air Service took over. NPAS found the site too expensive to operate from and looked for a new site. In 2019 they will be moving to a new site on North Weald Airfield.

Lippitts Hill camp also houses a nuclear bunker and the Civil Defence Control Room. The Control Room was built in 1946 as a 'spare' police information centre to replace Scotland Yard if needed. Most of the buildings, including barracks on site are still well preserved today.

CAR PARKING can be a problem and we are trying to resolve this in conjunction with the Village Hall Trustees. For the 9.15am Service you can park in the Village Hall car park but only ON THE GRAVEL as this will allow the hirers of the hall to park on the tarmac and unload from their cars, etc. At all other times please observe the parking notices and follow their instruction as hirers of the village hall have sole rights to park there. When parking in the churchyard, we respectfully ask you not to park outside the containers or along the right side of the roadway to the car park, in front of the Garden of Remembrance or block the access to the church. 5th March – SHROVE TUESDAY – Pancake Day

Have you ever wondered why we eat pancakes just before Lent? The tradition dates back to Anglo-Saxon times, when Christians spent Lent in repentance and severe fasting.

So on the Tuesday before Ash Wednesday, the church bell would summon them to confession, where they would be ‘shrive’, or absolved from their sins, which gives us *Shrove* Tuesday. At home, they would then eat up their last eggs and fat, and making a pancake was the easiest way to do this. For the next 47 days, they pretty well starved themselves.

Pancakes feature in cookery books as far back as 1493, and today’s pancake races are in remembrance of a panicked woman back in 1445 in Olney, Buckinghamshire. She was making pancakes when she heard the shriving bell calling her to confession. Afraid she’d be late, she ran to the church in a panic, still in her apron, and still holding the pan.

Flipping pancakes is also centuries old. A poem from Pasquil’s Palin in 1619 runs: “And every man and maide doe take their turne, And tosse their Pancakes up for feare they burne.”

Some people have noted that the ingredients of pancakes can be used to highlight four significant things about this time of year: eggs stand for creation, flour is the staff of life, salt keeps things wholesome, and milk stands for purity.

Shrove Tuesday is always 47 days before Easter Sunday and falls between 3rd February and 9th March.
