
Please DO NOT take donations to the Salvation Army at Sewardstone Street, Waltham Abbey as they can no longer accept goods.

SHOE BOX APPEAL

We are once again collecting filled shoeboxes to be delivered to deprived children and adults in Eastern Europe and Asia. Last year boxes were distributed in orphanages, schools, hospitals, care homes and gypsy villages.

Last year we were able to send 91 shoe boxes to Blythswood and it would be good to get to 100 this year! Blythswood distributed 107,073 shoe boxes to people in need last year.

It's easy to choose gifts for people that have so little – shampoo, a pair of socks, a notepad, a small toy, a bag of sweets – things we take for granted will seem like luxuries for people living in poverty. By filling a shoebox with simple things you can bring a smile this Christmas. Shoeboxes will be distributed to Albania, Bulgaria, Hungary, Kosovo, Moldova, Pakistan, Romania, Serbia and Ukraine.

Shoebox Appeal leaflets giving full information of items that are suitable for the shoebox are available from the back of the church or from Lyn & Dave Wackett at 94 Upshire Road, EN9 3PA or phone 01992 711573.

Shoeboxes should be delivered either to the church or to Lyn & Dave as above in time for the Harvest Festival Service on Sunday 13th October when they will be blessed before travelling on their way to people in need. The latest we can take shoeboxes is the end of October so if you can't make the Harvest Service your box can be taken to Lyn and Dave as above.

If you would like to help, but can't manage to fill a whole shoe box on your own, any items to go into the boxes can also be brought to Lyn and Dave, who will make up any extra boxes with the items given. Alternatively, it costs approximately £3,500 to £4,000 to send a container load to shoeboxes to Eastern Europe, so donations are also appreciated. Empty shoe boxes are also useful. Special thanks to Pearl, the lovely lady who covered 15 boxes for me early in the year, a really big help.
